







ne of the oldest homes in Essex, Conn., a historic town on the Connecticut River, this stately Colonial was constructed for a prominent shipbuilder in the 1730s. In 1988, the dwelling was purchased by its current owner, who restored the structure from top to bottom and furnished it with Early American antiques.
